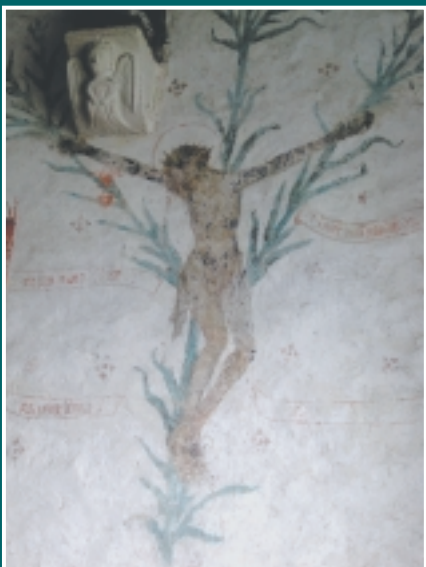

OBJECTS OF THE GUILD

1. Intercessory prayer for the dying and for the repose of the souls of the departed.
2. To promote the two great doctrines of the Christian Creed: "The Communion of Saints" and "The Resurrection of the Dead".

The following are particularly commended to the prayers of members.

- (a) The restoration of the scriptural rite of anointing the sick with holy oil, commonly called Holy Unction.
- (b) The restoration of the primitive custom of reserving the Holy Eucharist for the sick and dying.

To Pray must also mean to Care.

As members of this devotional Guild we must care for the dying, the dead and the bereaved.

CHARLES BROWN R.I.P.

Between 1993 and 2002 Charles Brown was General Secretary to The Guild. He was the first layman to hold that position since 1949. A very private person but a wonderful friend, Charles was born in Berkshire but became devoted at an early age to the City of London, its history and particularly its Churches, about which he became a mine of fascinating information. It was appropriate that between 1999 and 2006 Charles served as Churchwarden at St Vedast Church, Foster Lane so close to St Paul's Cathedral.

Charles was deeply interested in music and all matters cultural (he played the organ and the piano – and had his own grand piano which he had to give away when he moved from Islington to the Charterhouse in 2003). Charles was described as being an enormous support both to St Vedast and to London Diocese and indeed to The Church generally; he served for a number of years as Treasurer/Trustee of The Cleaver Charity. Charles died at the age of 88 on 13th August and his Requiem Mass and Funeral took place in St Vedast Church on 25th August. Following Cremation, arrangements are to be made for burial of ashes at his late sister's grave in High Wycombe. Charles is survived by his nephews and nieces, the children of his sister. We pray that his soul will rest in peace – and that he may rise in glory.

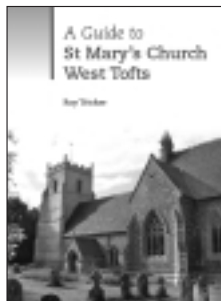

A simple book of prayers and meditations intended for anyone who may find it helpful, whether relatives, laity or priests.

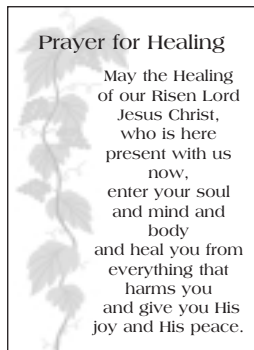
'A Lay Achievement'

Prayer Cards

The Guild produces 24 cards designed to be given to those who are sick or bereaved. These cards are proving very popular. Parishes, Guild Branches and individuals are all encouraged to apply to the General Secretary for further supplies and Guild Parishes are particularly urged to display them in church together with Membership forms and other Guild literature. 'Upon my Death'

This simple, practical leaflet aims to assist you and also help your relatives and executor and to prevent confusion about your wishes immediately after your death. You may record instructions about the type of funeral you would like, including hymns, burial/ cremation, flowers or donations in lieu and useful information such as where to find documents.

It is NOT a will and obviously must be kept in a very secure place. In line with Guild policy, there is no charge for this leaflet, but a suggested donation of at least 50p per copy would cover printing costs.



Bereavement websites and helplines

The Guild has produced a simple folded sheet containing useful information and contact details of bereavement organisations (as listed at the back of this Intercession Paper). This is designed to be given to the bereaved as an extension of pastoral ministry. Priests are encouraged to obtain several copies so they can be distributed when needed.

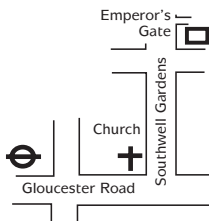

Turn 1st left into Southwell Gardens for the church entrance. For church hall, continue along Southwell Gardens, crossing Grenville Place into Emperor's Gate. The Hall is immediately on the right. Enter the side door on the left and go down the stairs.

Loving Father, as we celebrate your sacred gift of life, we pray for those who are tempted to assist or encourage others to take their own lives.

Let us pray for all families caring for terminally ill children.

We commend to God all who are concerned with the dying and the bereaved, especially nurses, doctors, undertakers, registrars and priests, that they may find words and actions that are truly comforting.

Lord, we pray for those who have been forgotten and have no-one to pray for them; for the thousands throughout the world who die from malnutrition, neglect, disease or because of war.

We pray for all the dead. Jesus said to the penitent thief: "Truly, I say to you, this day you will be with me in Paradise." May these words be heard by all our departed brothers and sisters, especially

Each night the Church's prayer is: "May the Lord grant us a quiet night and a perfect end." Let us pray that we may be delivered from sudden and unprepared death and for hope and confidence at the moment of our death.

We pray for the dying; for those dying in pain; for those dying alone and unloved; for those dying with little or no faith; for those dying receiving the last rites of the church.

Let us pray for all who work in chapels of rest, mortuaries, churchyards, cemeteries and crematoria and all who visit them; may their reverence and care reflect hope in the Resurrection of the body and everlasting life.

Lord, we pray for all who have experienced sudden, violent or accidental death and all those affected by it in any way, especially those who work in the police, ambulance and fire services and road, rail, sea and mountain rescue services.

We pray for all the dead, especially those remembered by the Guild of All Souls ; may they experience the joys of Heaven in the company of all the saints.
