OBJECTS OF THE GUILD

1. Intercessory prayer for the dying and for the repose of the souls of the departed.
2. To promote the two great doctrines of the Christian Creed: "The Communion of Saints" and "The Resurrection of the Dead".

The following are particularly commended to the prayers of members.

- (a) The restoration of the scriptural rite of anointing the sick with holy oil, commonly called Holy Unction.
- (b) The restoration of the primitive custom of reserving the Holy Eucharist for the sick and dying.

To Pray must also mean to care.

As members of this devotional Guild we must care for the dying, the dead and the bereaved.

From Dr Colin Podmore, A Member of the Council of the Guild

On 15 March 2023 we shall celebrate the 150th anniversary of the founding of the Guild by three laymen. Joseph Plimpton and Edmund Croom were the churchwardens of Fr Arthur Tooth's parish of St James Hatcham (in New Cross, South-East London); Joseph's son Walter was, like them, an enthusiastic member of Fr Tooth's congregation.

The Society for the Maintenance of the Faith, of which I have the honour to be President, will similarly be celebrating its 150th anniversary in 2023.

Both societies were founded as part of the Ritualist phase of the Catholic Movement; both remain true to their catholic identity; both emphasize the role of the laity (the Guild's Warden and the SMF's President must be lay); both are patron of a number of parishes.

There are also differences. The SMF was founded to acquire and administer patronage, as the principal means of fulfilling its Object ('to promote and maintain catholic teaching and practice within the Church of England'). By contrast, appointing clergy is not central to the Guild's purpose. Only in our fourth decade did we receive our first benefice – our flagship, St Stephen Gloucester Road.

Whereas the Guild has 41 benefices, the SMF now has 97, which will grow to over 100 when transfer of the Church Union's benefices is complete. Administering this patronage is the SMF's main focus. At least one appointment is always underway, so it has built up significant expertise.

Changes in the last fifty years have affected patronage work. Both societies are now often joint patrons of multi-parish benefices – usually with others who do not share our catholic commitment. Lay representatives have a veto, so we can only appoint a catholic priest with their support. Where presentation is suspended, we are consulted but the choice of a priest is the bishop's decision.

A resolution under the House of Bishops' Declaration is in force in 25 of the SMF's 97 benefices and 12 of the Guild's 41. Most of the others are no longer Anglo-Catholic parishes in any sense; some never were.

A catholic society cannot now use its patronage to introduce or maintain a catholic tradition where this does not enjoy the people's support. But where the people are committed to catholic teaching and practice, a catholic society as patron can use its expertise to support and defend them, not least by ensuring the appointment of a priest of catholic integrity who will take the tradition forward.

The Guild of All Souls Conference Report of 19th May 2022 – ‘When a Child has Died’

Bishop Norman opened the conference with a prayer and welcomed everybody to Walsingham again. He thanked those who had organised the online conference in 2021.

We heard from three speakers who had experienced the death of their children, Fr Paul Jones, Dr Margaret Brearley and Mrs Anne Gray.

Fr Paul Jones, whose daughter died soon after birth, began by showing two video clips of parents’ reactions after their child had died. In the secular world there is a tendency to give confidence to the suffering over death (John 20 vv24-29). He said, as a priest no two griefs are the same, we are all individuals. The inscription on his daughter’s gravestone is “Blessed are those invited to the supper of the Lamb” Rev.19.9.

In the first clip, a father told us of his daughter who died suddenly in her twenties. He said: “You want to shut yourself away. It is hard to face reality.” He pointed out that grief can make us feel wounded and, as an escape, he started running again – “Resurrection came from wounds for Thomas.” The second clip was from a mother and father whose young son had died. It was said there is often more support from outside the Church than in it. Family relationships can be different in death than in life. Feelings of guilt can emerge. People find it difficult to know what to say and sometimes friendships are lost. God’s providence is often understated. The Psalms can help, they are an excellent treasure trove. (Thoughtful discussions followed each clip).

In her talk Dr Margaret Brearley, Chair of the bereavement charity ‘The Compassionate Friends’, highlighted ways of supporting bereaved families. Her elder son, aged 20, had died suddenly. “Each mother’s and father’s grief is unique to them”,

every bereavement is different. Prayer is important, “it is like incense; it rises up to God”. Jews keep silence until the mourner speaks. We don’t get over grief, we live with it. Parents can be remorseful, blame themselves. Listening, talking and comforting are important – hugging is essential. Be positive with bereaved friends, visit, give assurance that things will improve, accept them as they are – and take them food. Don’t judge them in any way and don’t avoid talking about the person who has died.

Our final speaker was Mrs Anne Gray, a trustee of the Guild, who had had a miscarriage. She reminded us of the importance to realise that it is devastating for a parent if any of their children die in their own lifetime, whether as an infant or an adult or before birth. Parents whose children have died through miscarriage or stillbirth will mourn for the child they never had the opportunity to get to know. This can be especially hard when others in society dismiss the child as insignificant and do not regard the parents as bereaved. It is important for other people to make contact with those who are bereaved, to listen and use the name of the child when they speak and for clergy to visit as soon as possible after the death. Rituals are important, including both the funeral and memorial services in later years. Parents do want to know their children are not forgotten by others. At Mendlesham they hold an Annual Service of Light in November for parents and relatives of children who have died, of whatever cause and however long ago. Each person lights a candle during the service as a sign of prayer for the child dear to them who has died and the candles are placed on the altar. The candles are lit from the Paschal Candle, which serves to remind us that Christ is the Light of the world and that He is with us in our darkest times.

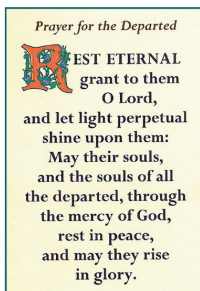

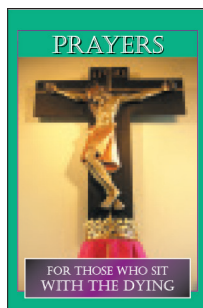
Prayer Cards

The Guild produces 24 cards designed to be given to those who are sick or bereaved.



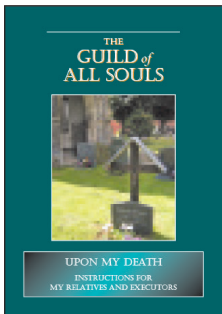

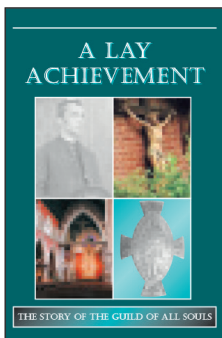
'Prayers for those who sit with the Dying'

This simple, practical leaflet aims to assist you and also help your relatives and executor and to prevent confusion about your wishes immediately after your death. You may record instructions about the type of funeral you would like, including hymns, burial/cremation, flowers or donations in lieu and useful information such as where to find documents.



It is NOT a will and obviously must be kept in a very secure place. In line with Guild policy, there is no charge for this leaflet, but a suggested donation of at least 50p per copy would cover printing costs.

Let us pray for all families caring for terminally ill children.

We commend to God all who are concerned with the dying and the bereaved, especially nurses, doctors, undertakers, registrars and priests, that they may find words and actions that are truly comforting.

Lord, we pray for those who have been forgotten and have no one to pray for them; for the thousands throughout the world who die from malnutrition, neglect, disease or because of war.

We pray for all the dead. Jesus said to the penitent thief: "Truly, say to you, this day you will be with me in Paradise." May these words be heard by all our departed brothers and sisters, especially

Each night the Church's prayer is: "May the Lord grant us a quiet night and a perfect end." Let us pray that we may be delivered from sudden and unprepared death and for hope and confidence at the moment of our death.

We pray for the dying; for those dying in pain; for those dying alone and unloved; for those dying with little or no faith; for those dying receiving the last rites of the church.

Let us pray for all who work in chapels of rest, mortuaries, churchyards, cemeteries and crematoria and all who visit them; may their reverence and care reflect hope in the Resurrection of the body and everlasting life.

Lord, we pray for all who have experienced sudden, violent or accidental death and all those affected by it in any way, especially those who work in the police, ambulance and fire services and road, rail, sea and mountain rescue services.

We pray for all the dead, especially those remembered by the Guild of All Souls ; may they experience the joys of Heaven in the company of all the saints.

We pray for the dying; may death be to them the gate of everlasting life.

Let us pray for all who care for the dying; may they see in their dying brothers and sisters the person of Christ Himself and continue their ministry of care with compassion and love.

We pray for all the bereaved, especially those suffering from distress, guilt, lack of forgiveness, sleeplessness, depression, loneliness, anger or lack of purpose; may they experience the love of Christ.

We pray for all who have taken their own lives; that in the life of the world to come they may be released from the prison of despair and suffering that they endured before death and experience the joy of the Resurrection.

Lord, we pray for all the departed, especially Grant them rest and peace, and to each of us such a measure of communion with them as you know to be best for us.

We pray for all who will die today; that they may hear those words of Christ, "Today you will be with me in Paradise."

Loving Heavenly Father, we pray for all children who have died; for those miscarried or aborted and those who have been stillborn. May they be freed from any pain they have experienced and be at peace in your kingdom.

Christ, our Loving Lord, in your kindness be with all the bereaved and bring them your comfort and peace. May our concern for them be a reflection of your love.

Let us commend to God the unrested dead. May they go their way to their everlasting home assured that our prayers follow them. May all harmful influence be removed from any people who have been disturbed.

We pray for our departed brothers and sisters, all the dead in Christ and all the dead whose faith is known to God alone. May they share in eternal life with Him.

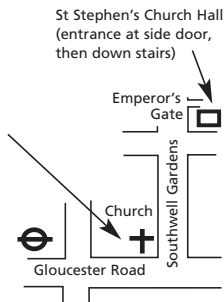
